Real Estate Appraisal Education Scholarship FAQs

What is an appraiser?

An appraiser develops and reports an opinion of value on a specific type of property. Real Property Appraisal: the valuation of real estate. Real Property Appraisers can choose specialty practices such as residential, commercial, or agricultural.

What skills are required to become an appraiser?

All appraisers must have good analytical skills and work well with numbers. In addition, appraisers spend much time interacting with clients and writing reports, so good oral and written communications skills are a must.

Is there a college degree requirement to become a Real Property Appraiser?

There are college-level education requirements for the State Licensed, Certified Residential and Certified General classifications. Visit the Appraisal Institute website, www.appraisalinstitute.org/education/your-career/ for more information. The AQB announced that as of January 1, 2015, a bachelor's degree will be required for both Certified categories and an associate's degree, or 30 semester credit hours of college-level education from an accredited college, junior college, community college, or university, will be required for State Licensed Residential.

How do I become a Real Property Appraiser?

The first step to becoming a real estate appraiser is to obtain a Trainee license.

<u>Course Requirements</u>: To obtain a Trainee license, an applicant must successfully complete 75 hours of appraisal specific education. (All Appraisal Institute courses are approved in all 50 states.) The classes that need to be completed are:

- Basic Appraisal Principles (30 hours)
- Basic Appraisal Procedures (30 hours)
- National Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (15 hours)

<u>Other Requirements:</u> All Trainees are required to work under the direct supervision of a Certified Appraiser. You may check each state's requirements by visiting their websites for specific information. Both the supervisory appraiser and trainee are required to complete a 4-hour seminar on the role and responsibilities of each person.
